ICONIC FIGHTER CELEBRATES 75TH ANNIVERSARY

As a kid growing up with neighbours who served during WWII, I became interested in anything regarding the weapons of that era. The Spitfire was definitely one of these. Gibraltar has issued (September 28th) a very nice set of 4 stamps and a souvenir sheet. Please read below.

The Supermarine Spitfire is a British single-seat fighter aircraft used by the Royal Air Force and many other Allied countries throughout the Second World War. The Spitfire continued to be used into the 1950s both as a front line fighter and in secondary roles. It was produced in greater numbers than any other British aircraft and was the only Allied fighter in production throughout the war.

The Spitfire was designed as a short-range high-performance interceptor aircraft by R. J. Mitchell, chief designer at Supermarine Aviation Works (since 1928 a subsidiary of Vickers-Armstrong). Mitchell continued to refine the design until his death from cancer in 1937, whereupon his colleague Joseph Smith became chief designer. The Spitfire's elliptical wing had a thin cross-section, allowing a higher top speed than several contemporary fighters, including the Hawker Hurricane. Speed was seen as essential to carry out the mission of home defence against enemy bombers.

During the Battle of Britain there was a public perception that the Spitfire was the RAF fighter of the battle whereas in fact the more numerous Hurricane actually shouldered a greater proportion of the burden against the Luftwaffe: the Spitfire units did, however, have a lower attrition rate and a higher victory to loss ratio than those flying Hurricanes.

After the Battle of Britain, the Spitfire became the backbone of RAF Fighter Command and saw action in the European, Mediterranean, Pacific and the South-East Asian theatres.

Much loved by its pilots, the Spitfire served in several roles, including interceptor, photo-reconnaissance, fighter-bomber, carrier-based fighter, and trainer. It was built in many different variants, using several wing configurations. Although the original airframe was designed to be powered by a Rolls-Royce Merlin engine producing 1,030hp (768 kW), it was adaptable enough to use increasingly more powerful Merlin and the later Rolls-Royce Griffon engines; the latter was eventually able to produce 2,035 hp (1,520 kW).

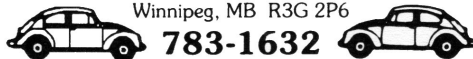

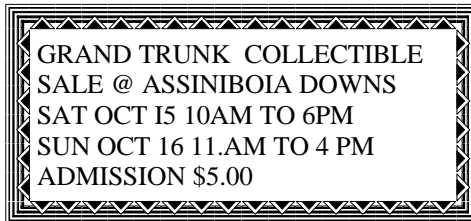

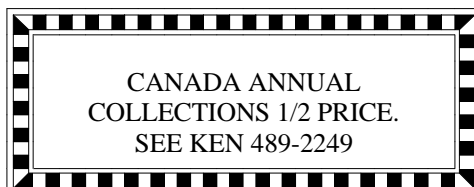

The Webb Ellis Cup.

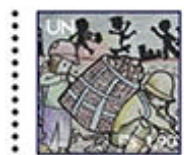

Some Like It Hot

US Post will be issuing a stamp to honour Billy Wilder, as part of a series remembering America's great directors.

Some Like It Hot of 1959 is his most-famous comedy; the film starred Tony Curtis, Jack Lemmon and Marilyn Monroe; Marilyn is pictured on the stamp beside a portrait of Wilder.

Austria honoured Wilder in 2003 with a postage stamp; he was born in Sucha-Beskidzka in Austria-Hungary, a town that is now part of Poland.



Against Child Labour

The United Nations Postal Administration (UNPA) recently received the Asiago International Award for Philatelic Art for a stamp that publicized the problem of child labour. The prize is given annually under the

patronage of the President of Italy.

Not a Postage Stamp

Russia has issued a set of vignettes to honour the fiftieth birthday of US President Barak Obama. These "stamps" have no postal validity; the number "50" is for Obama's age.

Postal VIII - A Swedish Postal Historian's Treasure

The 2009 Facit catalogue Postal VIII is a postal history gold mine of information for any collector interested in Swedish philately. It lists all 56 different types of cancels used on Swedish stamps including the straight line, small and large box, "arc" and the many versions of the Single Ring Cancel. All cancels are identified by location and pricing is provided in Swedish Kronor for each type of cancel on various stamp designs.

The catalogue also lists all of the cancels used on maritime routes, train routes, special cancels and on military post mail (including Finnish cancels used on the Swedish Volunteer Corps mail during WWII).

This latest edition also lists all of the Swedish perfins and their pricing on various issues of stamps.

Swedish postal labels are not excluded and the Registration, COD and Postal Due types are also included. At approximately \$70 it may appear pricey but it will provide many hours of entertainment on a cold winters night.

New Issues

Åland



On September 18th, Åland issued two stamps as part of their continuing scenery series. A Inrikes denominated stamp (good for postage within Finland) shows the shoreline of Kökar and a Europa denominated issue (good for postage to Europe) shows the shoreline of Jomala. This stamp also shows the SEPAC symbol used by members of the Small European Postal

Administrations Committee.

Sweden

An Interview with Robin Harris, Editor of the Unitrade Specialized Catalogue of Canadian Stamps

The Winnipeg Philatelic Society had the great fortune of hearing Robin Harris speak on the changes made to the Unitrade catalogue over the last 5 years.

Buffalo: Robin, how long have you been a member of the WPS?

Harris: I joined the club around 1975. At first a little nervous around some of the more experienced collectors, but settled into my own.

Buffalo: What do you collect?

Harris: At first Canadian; then later, the United States. I still keep the US collection up to date.

Buffalo: Have you written items for the Buffalo, at any time?

Harris: Yes, I did. I also was Editor of the Buffalo from 1984/85 until 1995.

Buffalo: Have you done any writing other than the Unitrade? (*sorry folks, I did not realize at the time Robin had wrote and published 5 of the Definitive Series Specialized books in 1997*)

Harris: The books in the Elizabethan Era where my first self-published volumes (for the readers, they were the Caricature and Landscape series of 1972-1978; the 1977-1987 Environment issues; the 1982-1989 Artifact and Parliament definitives; the 1987-1996 Wildlife and Architecture series; and the Fruit and Flag definitives of 1989-1996).

Buffalo: When did you join Unitrade? and was it as the Editor?

Harris: I joined Unitrade Press in November of 2004, after spending several years with the Saskatoon Stamp Centre.

a new definitive series with Her Majesty the Queen Margrethe II's portrait.

After the stamps were issued, it became regrettably apparent that the printed stamps did not live up to the high quality, which POST Greenland normally delivers. The error in quality occurred despite many control and security measures. Because of the qualitative error the sales of the two definitive stamps has been discontinued in the post offices of Greenland as of 26th May 2011.

To replace the stamps, the printing of two new stamps with the same portrait of the Queen is being initiated. These stamps will be issued in the high quality that POST Greenland stands for.

In POST Greenland's opinion the two withdrawn stamps will not constitute philatelic variants, which is to say rare and sought after issues. The reason for this is that stamp collectors all over the world, who have standing orders for POST Greenland's new stamps, have already received the two stamps, as is the custom at any stamp issue. The decision to reprint the stamps has only been made because POST Greenland wishes to deliver the highest quality of stamps.
